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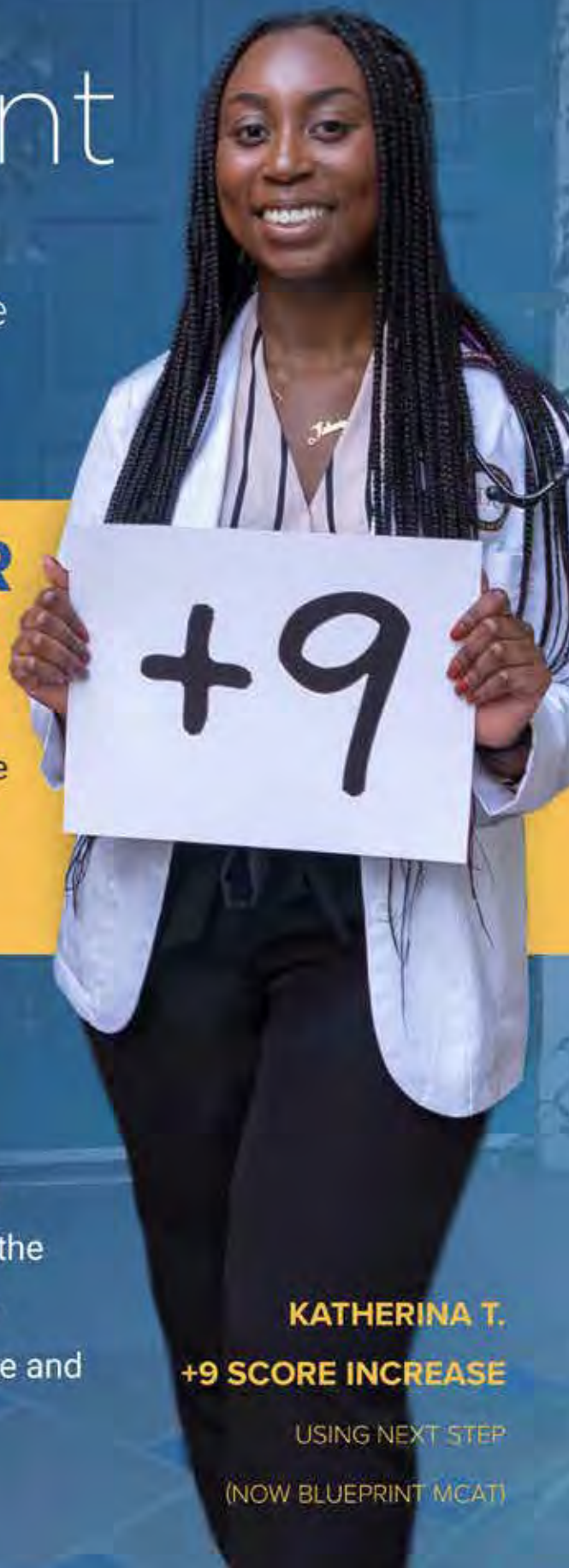

VISITING CLERKSHIP PROGRAM (VCP)



sponsored by the

Harvard Medical School Minority Faculty Development Program

Open to full-time 4th-year and qualified 3rd-year from underrepresented in medicine (URIM) students in good standing at U.S. accredited medical schools who wish to participate in a clerkship in any discipline at Harvard Medical School (HMS) affiliated hospitals. Housing and financial assistance towards transportation expenses to and from Boston are available. Students are assigned a faculty advisor, provided the opportunity to network with HMS residency training programs and have access to the medical school library, seminars and workshops. Clerkships are offered year-round. Applications must be submitted 3-6 months in advance of the desired rotation. Students who are applying to the VCP must have completed their core clerkships in medicine, surgery, pediatrics, and obstetrics. In addition to completion of the core requirements, all students applying to the VCP must have completed USMLE Step 1 prior to the start of their rotation.

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VISITING RESEARCH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (VRIP)



sponsored by the

Harvard Catalyst Program for Faculty Development and Diversity Inclusion

VRIP is an 8-week, mentored summer research program open to 1st and 2nd year U.S. medical students, particularly underrepresented minority and/or disadvantaged individuals from accredited U.S. medical schools. VRIP is designed to enrich medical students' interest in research and health-related careers, particularly clinical/translational research careers. In addition to a mentored clinical/translational research experience, VRIP students participate in weekly seminars with Harvard faculty focusing on topics such as research methodology, health disparities, ethics, and career paths. VRIP students also have the opportunity to participate in offerings of other Harvard Medical School programs such as career development seminars and networking dinners. VRIP offers students housing as well as a salary and transportation reimbursement for travel to and from Boston. Applicants must be U.S. Citizens or U.S. Noncitizen Nationals or U.S. Permanent Residents.

The Commonwealth Fund Fellowship in Health Policy & Practice

The Commonwealth Fund Fellowship in Minority Health Policy at Harvard University

The Fellowship, a one-year, degree-granting, and full-time program, prepares physicians for leadership roles in transforming health care delivery systems and promoting health policies and practices that improve access to high performance health care for racial and ethnic minorities, economically disadvantaged groups, and other vulnerable populations. Program offers intensive study in leadership/health policy, public health, and management. Fellows complete academic work leading to a Master of Public Health degree at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health or a Master of Public Administration degree at the Harvard Kennedy School. Fellows also participate in leadership forums and seminars with nationally recognized leaders in health care delivery systems, minority health, and health policy; site visits, shadowing, and practicum projects.

Eligibility: BC/BE required, experience in addressing health needs of vulnerable populations, interest in health policy, interest in transforming health care delivery systems for vulnerable populations, U.S. citizenship or U.S. permanent residency.

Benefits: \$60,000 stipend; tuition and fees; health insurance; other program expenses.

The Wilbert C. Jordan (WCJ) Research Forum was introduced in 1984 as part of the Student National Medical Association (SNMA)'s Annual Medical Education Conference to extend an opportunity for SNMA members to display their scientific competence and award them for their academic and research accomplishments. Since its inception, more than \$155,000 has been awarded to Forum participants. Support for the Research Forum has come from several individuals, organizations, and corporate entities that are aligned with SNMA's goals and programs. Most notably, the Forum has been consistently supported by generous contributions from The Charles R. Drew University and Dr. Jordan himself.

In 1999, the SNMA House of Delegates voted to name the Research Forum after Dr. Wilbert C. 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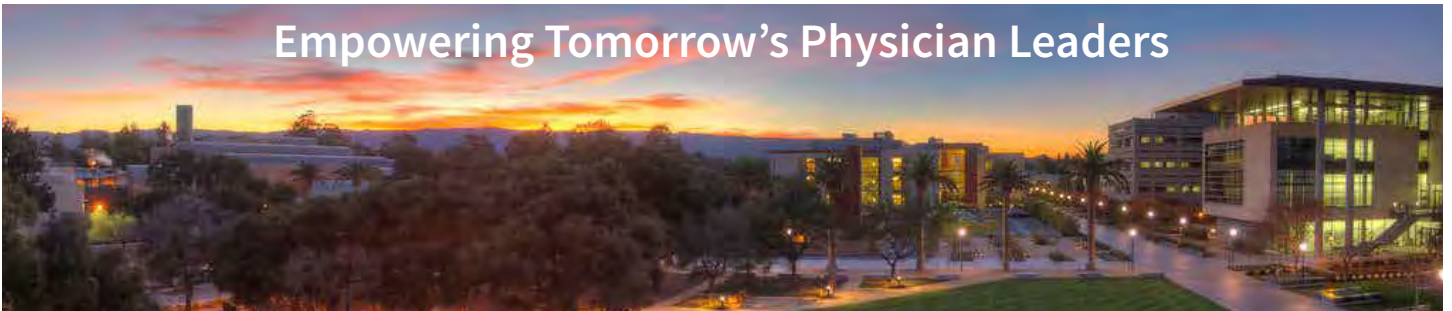
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
